## DISSECT: THE WORD IDENTIFICATION STRATEGY <br> RULES OF TWOS AND THREES

## Rule 1

$>$ If a stem or any part of a stem begins with a vowel, separate the first two letters from the rest of the stem and pronounce them
$>$ If the stem or any part of the stem begins with a consonant, separate the first three letters from the rest of the stem and pronounce them
$>$ Once you have separated the first two or three letters from the stem, apply the same rules until you reach the end of the stem (ex: al/ter/na/tor)

## Rule 2

$>$ Isolate the first letter of the stem and try to apply Rule 1 again. Rule 2 is especially useful when the stem begins with two or three consonants

## Rule 3

> If two different vowels appear together in a word, pronounce both of the vowel sounds. If that doesn't sound right, pronounce one vowel sound at a time until it sounds right. Rule 3 can be applied in conjunction with either Rule 1 or Rule 2
